<u>PILLAR REPORTS:</u> Education/ Prevention Pillar	<p>Presentations on the Dose of Reality campaign were done as noted in last meeting to the community at Cedar Grove High School, Senior meal sites in Sheboygan county, and we attended health fairs and the MHSA Resource Fair and the Random Lake High School Health Fair this last month. We will be outreaching to the low income housing apartments in Sheboygan. Who is not here? Schools. Email was sent to administration at the alternative school in Sheboygan. And outreach to Elkhart Lake and Plymouth will be done. Identity priorities- Recovery Month, September, and having a panel or speaker for that as a town hall meeting. Asking full committee for help with finding a speaker or panel and we will need resources to pay for the event.. Discussion of a video or poster contest for youth on substance abuse prevention for 2017 with information going out in 2016.</p> <p>Prevention Roundtable:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Liz and Mary reported on the Pharmacy opioid Meeting held 5/10/16 evening. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ 13 attendees (either pharmacist or pharmacist tech). 	

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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Explained to the group that this wasn't a HSC2020 or Public Health group but their group which HSC 2020 was willing to assist them. Group would like to continue to meet on a quarterly basis and a couple of members indicated willing to develop agendas, etc – next meeting will be in September 2016. ▪ Discussed various initiatives which include events connecting pharmacists and prescribers implemented in other counties with the possibility of replicating in our county. A planning committee was formed with plans to have the first event in September 2016. ○ Prescriber event in June <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ 6/23/16 at 5:30, UW-S Wombat Room. Loree Shriver from Advanced Pain Mgmt. is spearheading the event, marketing to prescribers in the area. Presentation will include representatives from law enforcement, the Prescription Drug Monitoring Program, DEA diversion investigation, and healthcare practitioners. ○ Radio Awareness event last week Friday with Midwest Communications <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ MWC News Director Areka Spencer (former WHBL news director) proposed a live show regarding heroin and prescription drug problem, aired on all 3 AM stations in the area (Wausau, Green Bay and Sheboygan). Included live interviews with law enforcement, EMS, elected officials, support groups, family members, treatment professionals, and people in recovery. The coverage was focused on the scope of the problem and was intended to raise awareness. 	
Harm Reduction Pillar	<p>456 pounds of drugs were collected at the Take Back Day on April 30</p> <p>Who wasn't at the Table – Faith Community. Reach out to Cully but will follow up.</p> <p>Needle Exchange Info – Aids Resource Center of Wisconsin has a van that comes on the third Wednesday of the month from 11 am to 1 pm to do a needle exchange in Sheboygan. Will be reaching out to other communities to see what they are doing.</p> <p>Sharps containers- exploring the idea of working with 24 hour stores to ensure that there are places for safe disposal of needles within our community as we know that people utilize this facilities and may be using needles in their restrooms. Our group felt this might be a good way to start the needle exchange program within our community.</p>	

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	<p>Narcan Training – had talked about the need to expand the narcan training to include additional sites within our county</p> <p>Train the Trainer for Peer Support – exploring opportunities for training for peer support trainers from the Connecticut Community for Addiction Recovery.</p>	
Treatment Pillar	Lindsay reached out to residential services provider to come to the table. Planning a networking event for all AODA treatment providers in August. Looking for ideas for a topic to bring to the meeting that would benefit the providers--thus benefit the clients. Asked for input from the group to think about Recovery Support Coaches? Pharmacist? Other ideas?	
Law Enforcement Pillar	<p>State law change with PDMP--Law enforcement is now required to report to PDMP any investigations involving prescription medications including thefts, overdoses, and illegal sales or diversion. Working on developing a form to capture the information required to be reported.</p> <p>Drug Endangered Children-- Currently working with DHHS Child Protective Services on protocol update to include all drugs instead of being focused solely on meth labs.</p>	
Workplace Pillar	<p>Kohler HR presentation—Kurt has been invited to present to Kohler HR and top management on drug abuse in the workplace along with their EAP provider, May 24th. Kohler is looking to review and update their current substance abuse policy.</p> <p>Reach out to other community entities for involvement in committee—Kurt spoke with a representative of the Sheboygan County Job Center who is enthusiastic about helping with job placement efforts for those in recovery and invited him to future meetings.</p>
