We will be finalizing the association documents and discussing how we can best support each other. We have also been looking into some possible funding sources. We will be submitting a proposal to The Stefanie H. Weill Center to use their facility next to the theater as a recovery community center. There is a lot of work to do and everyone involved is volunteering their time. We are so grateful.</p> <p>Robert has been looking into recovery coach training. He talked with Mandy Suthers the CEO and founder of Darjune recovery community center and services. She is now in charge</p>	Informational

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	of recovery coach training in the area. They do the training either five days during the week or, they do 2 back-to-back weekends on Saturday and Sunday. It is the CCAR (Connecticut) model training which if you go to Connecticut to get it the cost is \$800. Their goal is to get as many people trained in Wisconsin as possible so their price is \$450 per person. But they have a discount for organizations which brings it to \$400 per person. That includes the manual and lunch during the training. They have also developed a liability waiver and a case plan that they include with the training. It also includes one year of free consulting to anyone who's been through the course. They can do class sizes up to 35 people. We are looking into getting funding to get a group trained to work at the recovery community center.
