SBIRT Sub-Committee Update (Kari Keller/Shelby Kuhn) • Summary • Barriers • Celebrations • Asks	SBIRT in the school setting presentation scheduled for Wednesday, September 21 st from 8:30-10am. Shelby asked the group if they would be willing to move the September MHSA committee meeting from 9-10am to 10-11am. The group decided to cancel the September meeting. The next MHSA full committee meeting will be Wednesday, November 16 th from 9-10am. Dr. Richard Brown will be doing SBIRT training on October 19 th . There will be a morning and afternoon session with the afternoon session being provider focused. Everyone is invited to attend both of these trainings.
Heroin Sub-Committee Update (Libby Holte/Kurt Zempel)	Lindsay reported that the group is focusing on the five pillars. Pillar updates are as follows:
 Summary Barriers Celebrations Asks 	<u>Treatment:</u> Invitation has been sent out for an AODA treatment provider networking event on August 25 th from 8-9:30am. Bringing treatment providers together may help identify possible gaps in the community. They are looking at holding another CEU (continuing education units) training for Spring 2017. <u>Harm Reduction:</u> Looking into needle exchange in Sheboygan County. They have heard of problems of needles being taken out of public sharps containers. October 22 nd is the next state medication take back day.

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Stigma Sub Committee Undate (Vate Paer)	Anyone is welcome to join the Harm Reduction Pillar meetings on the second Monday of each month at 10am. Prevention/Education: Met on June 30 th with community partners including Plymouth schools, clinics, and some faith based communities. Plymouth is looking into adding education to their community and schools. The "I Love My Addict" Workplace: A survey for local companies is being put together to better understand their drug policies and if they discriminate against drug users. Law Enforcement: Drug Endangered Children protocol is being finished. June 23 rd there was a prescriber roundtable which included 84 people. Hoping to do another event in the fall with even more providers present.
 Stigma Sub-Committee Update (Kate Baer) Summary Barriers Celebrations Asks 	The last meeting included brainstorming to ensure we're on target to meet the goals of the CHIP. They discussed Trauma Informed Care and Stigma awareness. Katie Pruitt is the new Trauma-Informed Care Coordinator with Sheboygan County Health and Human Services. Kate will invite Katie to the next MHSA full committee meeting to speak to the group. All Health and Human Services employees will be attending a TIC training. There is also a legal focused TIC training on September 29 th from 8-Noom that is open to the public.
