Connie will get the survey used previously at this event for the group to evaluate survey questions asking about how attitudes/behaviors changed due to the information presented at the fair (there has not been any question previously; no baseline). Things of note for the next fair: Is it possible to have two separate rooms available at RCS? One for the speakers and the other for the "fair" presenters? Would like to put a lot more focus on personal stories being shared.

Connie Frank – RCS is having staff complete a survey three times throughout the year – an initial survey, and then every 6 months after that to evaluate changing opinions on mental health topics (reduction in stigma). WISE is working with RCS & Mental Health America on using this survey as a measuring tool. RCS is slotted to play the "pilot" for Sheboygan County. Dr. Corrigan will evaluate the survey results. Connie will evaluate the costs/manning for the RCS survey roll-out for the group to get a better estimate.
	Jon Doll – Sargento (Lou Gentine) has expressed strong support for mental health and suicide awareness support in the County. They could perhaps be another source of "pilot" information for stigma reduction tools. Will check to see if they are open to the idea.
	Kate Baer – A huge focus right now is Honest, Open, Proud – would like to get Sue McKenzie here for train-the-trainer for the group; the adult material is finalized and going well, but there is a teen "agenda" in the works for WISE. Possibly start that at Kohler High School? We have Wood County's CHIP available for review (they already have awareness events going each year).
